1. Introduction

The Cutting Crime Impact (CCI) project is a project that will enable a preventative, evidence-based and sustainable approach to tackling high-impact petty crime. Cutting Crime Impact (CCI) is a 3-year project (started 1 October 2018) funded by the European Commission's Horizon 2020 Programme. Horizon 2020 is the EU's largest Research and Innovation programme. CCI will result in greater openness to innovation and design approaches amongst LEAs and security policymakers across Europe. For more information, please refer to www.cuttingcrimeimpact.eu.

The University of Salford in partnership with LEAs and security policymakers from across Europe are delivering the CCI Project. There are six Law Enforcement Agencies (LEAs) participating in CCI: Greater Manchester Police – UK; National Police of the Netherlands; Politsei- ja Piirivalveamet – Estonia; Policia Municipal de Lisboa, Camara Municipal de Lisboa – Portugal; Landeskriminalamt Niedersachsen – Germany; and Departament d'Interior – Generalitat de Catalunya – Spain.

Other members of the CCI project consortium: DSP groep bv – the Netherlands; Rijksuniversiteit Groningen – the Netherlands; Deutscher Präventionstag Institut (DPI) – Germany; European Forum for Urban Security (Efus) – France; Globaz SA – Portugal.

Members of the advisory board are: Ministry of Security and Justice, the Netherlands; Italian Forum for Urban Security; Institute of Criminology, University of Cambridge; Chair of Homeland Security and Public Health Sciences, The Pennsylvania State University; European Network of Law Enforcement Technology Services – the Netherlands; and Chair of EU COST Action TU1203, Crime Prevention Through Urban Design & Planning (CP-UDP) – Italy.

The Dutch research and consultancy bureau DSP-groep (www.DSP-groep.eu) is a research partner in the CCI project and is responsible for a survey of key texts and concepts informing practice of the CCI partners, other LEAs and security policymakers—Task 1.2.

2. The Survey

CCI grant agreement

Task 1.2: Compile directory of key texts and concepts informing practice. An online survey will be developed to identify key concepts informing LEAs and security policymaker practice in the four focus areas covered by CCI: (i) predictive policing; (ii) community policing; (iii) CP-UDP; and (iv) measuring and mitigating citizens' feelings of insecurity. The survey will be administered to practitioners and expert networks to which the consortium has access (N = 1,000+), including: Efus; EU COST Action TU1203; E-DOCA & ICA networks; ENLETS; DPTI and CEN TC 325 (working on European crime prevention standards in the 14383 series). Survey results will be analysed to identify the key texts, approaches (including 'emerging' concepts) and guidance informing the thinking and practice of LEAs and security policymakers about tackling high impact petty crime. Results will be compiled to create a directory of the 'most cited' texts and 'emerging' concepts (D1.2).

Task leader: DSP (Paul van Soomeren)

After the first CCI kick-off meeting at the University of Salford, in Greater Manchester (October 2018), an online survey was developed to identify key concepts informing LEAs and security policymaker practice in the four focus areas covered by CCI:

- Predictive policing;
- Community policing;
- Crime Prevention through Urban Design and Planning; CP- UDP;
- Measuring and mitigating citizens' feelings of insecurity.

The aim of the survey was to create a directory of the 'most used' texts and 'emerging concepts' from the perspective of practitioners. A draft survey designed by DSP-groep and the University of Salford was sent to all CCI participants for feedback (see 4. Annex box 1).

The finalised survey was administered to practitioner and expert networks to which the consortium has access. Firstly, the survey was administered to all the participating LEAs and other CCI partners, such as DPT (2,000+ members) and Efus (2,000 members), as well as members of the advisory board. Secondly, a range of other relevant networks were included in the survey, including participants in the COST Action TU1203, the European Designing Out Crime Association (E-DOCA), European networks of the International CPTED Association (ICA) and participants in the standardisation work in crime prevention CEN TC 325 (working on European crime prevention standards in the 14383 series). In a

special webinar that DSP delivered for CEPOL (European Union Agency for Law Enforcement Training), the CCI project was also introduced to an audience of police officers (100+) and the link to the survey was presented.

The survey—an online survey using Survey Monkey—was through this snowballing approach distributed across relevant practitioner networks. CCI asked the first set of respondents to fill in the survey and then pass the email and survey link to other relevant colleagues. In the cases of Efus, DPT and the ICA, the mail and survey link was included in a newsletter or sent to network members.

The survey was distributed at the end of November 2018 (see 4. Annex box 2). Due to problems getting responses to surveys in December (a busy time of year due to the financial year end and Christmas), the survey was left open for longer and reminders were sent. After approximately 2 weeks, a formal reminder was sent out to the original group of participants (see 4. Annex box 3). At the beginning of January 2019, it was decided to extend the deadline two more weeks, as well as to leave the survey open throughout 2019. This will mean that CCI can disseminate the survey link via its website, events and presentations.

In order to meet January 31st deadline, this report is based on all respondent information obtained up until mid-January 2019. At this time, there were a total number of 66 respondents. It should be noted that results are still coming in—and the report may therefore be updated later in the year.

3. Overview Survey Monkey

The respondents were divided over the **diverse** institutional layers working on crime prevention: LEAs of course, but also local and national governments, NGOs and other institutions.

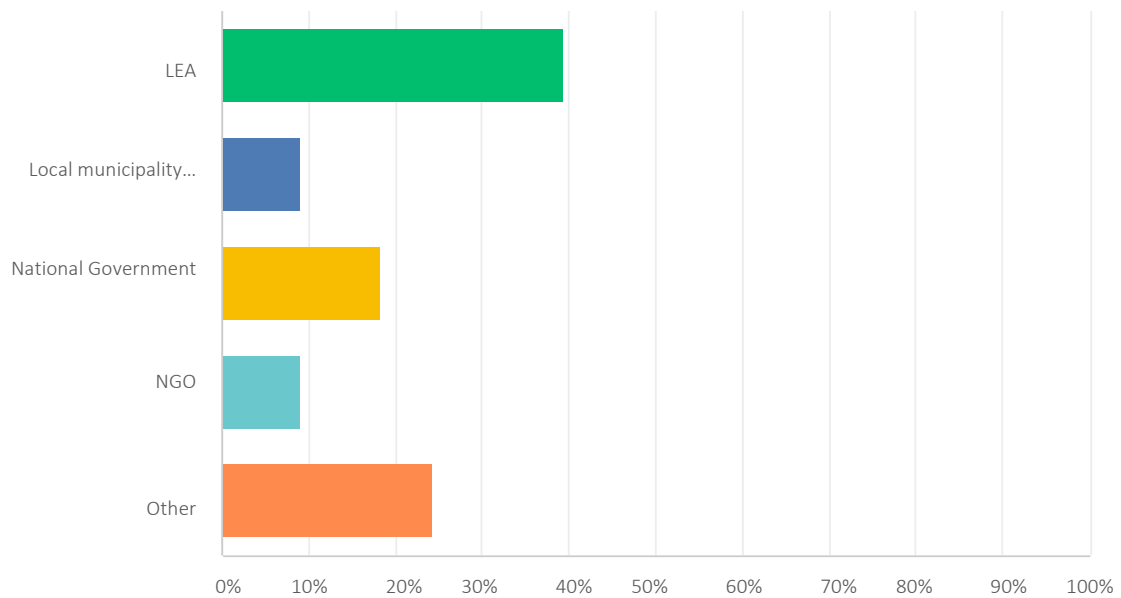


Figure 1: Q1 For what type of organisation do you work?

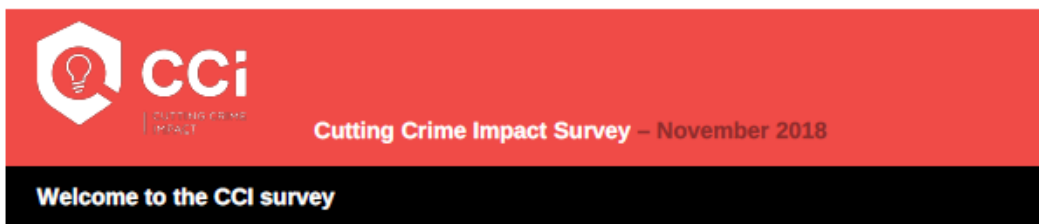
